Dear Mrs. Davis:

On July 25, 2007, I submitted a complaint against a Louisiana-licensed attorney, Mr. S. Mark Klyza (2007-ADMIN-0892). I felt that Mr. Klyza violated four provisions of the Louisiana Rules of Professional Conduct. I received a response from Mr. James T. Daly (Screening Counsel) dated August 1, 2007. Mr. Daly stated that no rules were violated as the letter Mr. Klyza sent the St. Mary and Terrebonne Parish Sheriff's Office was "...expresses wishes and opinions on behalf of his client. Such communication does not violate ethical rules."

An attorney is considered to be a respected professional, with a character that seeks to find the truth. When Mr. Klyza sent the letter to the Sheriff's Office he was stating that the contents of the letter were material fact. Mr. Klyza was passing on to the Sheriff's Offices that I was harassing his client when no such event had occurred.

I must admit that I am very disappointed in the injustice that has occurred. I had thought that the Louisiana Disciplinary Board would take action against such unethical actions. It seems that the Disciplinary Board has done nothing but ignore a valid complaint from a victim.

You can read the evidence for yourself that proves no harassment had ever taken place.

If the Disciplinary Board chooses to ignore my pleas, then that will be on their conscience.
